FIRST GRADE



FOURTH GRADE

We are all settled in and enjoying learning. Some exciting things have been happening in 4th grade!

Reading: The students just finished up their 1st novel of the year, "Tales of a 4th Grade Nothing". We will work in the Journeys Reading Series for a while then move on to Novel 2, "Finding the Titanic". They are great readers!

Math: We have started Unit 2 in our math program that will work on multiplication and division of whole numbers. We are also writing checks and keeping a bank register for our banking unit and using Mountaineer Football statistics to practice rounding, averages, bar graphing, and converting measurements.

Science: We just finished working with light bulbs and circuits in our science unit and are beginning work with magnetism. They love the discovery that happens during our science labs.

Social Studies: We have created a 50 States bulletin board and are learning a lot about each one of them. They are even singing "Fifty Nifty United States" in class. Most have them all memorized!

We are off to a great start and I love the enthusiasm coming from this group. They are very eager to learn and our days go by quickly because we are having fun. 5th Grade just finished learning about the Powers of 10 and is now focusing on decimal place value: rounding, ordering, written form, adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing.

6th Grade just finished reviewing factors and multiples, and is now focusing on the division of fractions.

7th Grade has been working with operations using negative and positive numbers. This week we have been learning about multiplying and dividing negative and positive numbers. It is also expected that we apply these rules to fractions and decimals as well.

PARENTS AS POWERFUL PARTNERS/ LITTLE LEARNER'S SCHEDULE WILL BEGIN IN EARLY OCTOBER

We are pleased to share that Aurora School is now finalizing the programs entitled **“Parents as Powerful Partners”** and **“Little Learners”** to begin the week of October 10th for Preschool children and their parents or childcare providers. This program is for all Preschool children in our attendance district. [Daytime childcare providers may bring children to this program.] The PAPP/ Little Learner’s Programs will work in conjunction to offer weekly a library hour in the school library for children ages 2, 3, and 4. The library experience will include weekly checking out books for in home reading materials appropriate for preschoolers. Also a resource center will be available for checking out items such as board games, DVDs on shapes, colors, number, letters, puzzles, etc. for you to use at home. There will also be a playgroup hour with academic readiness opportunity each week. Children will be able to play and develop proper social/emotional skill with peers during this time, as well as work on academic stations to further develop age appropriate basic academic skills. Children ready to begin basic skill on computers will have access during the playgroup hour with academic stations to further develop age appropriate basic academic skills. Children ready to begin basic skills on computers will have access during the playgroup hour to work on the ABC MOUSE program that is free in the school setting.

The goal for this program is to give families opportunity without leaving the community to ready their preschool children for wonderful success when entering the formal kindergarten setting. We believe we have a need in our rural community to offer preschoolers a library and playgroup experience weekly to help them further develop socially, emotionally, and academically.
