CLUB POLICIES:

Enrollment: Students MUST enroll in a club to participate. Club enrollment is held during the club fair at the beginning of the school year (during LINKS). Enrollment periods are the only time a student may enroll or change their status in a club (unless the student is new to PHS). Students who are new to PHS will need to complete a club registration form in guidance. The clubs' coordinator will then register the new student with the club sponsor's approval and e-mail the new student's LINKS teacher to inform the new student of the approvals or denials. Clubs may establish a cap on their enrollment with enrollment being first come, first serve, followed by priority given to juniors and seniors. In the event a wait list is established, priority status will be as follows: seniors, juniors, sophomores, and freshmen.

New Clubs: To form a new club at PHS, the club must have a faculty/staff sponsor, must be within the educational scope of the school, and follow all school policies regarding positive culture and character.

Club Termination: Club termination will be at the discretion of the administration. Clubs must adhere to student code of conduct (cannot promote or engage in activities that are considered detrimental to the culture of the school or in poor taste). Sponsors who wish to terminate a club will need to seek approval of administration. If administration believes the club should continue, the current sponsor and the clubs' coordinator will attempt to find a new sponsor.

Club Rotations: Every effort is made to provide students with the greatest possible chance of participation in multiple clubs. Due to time constraints, clubs will overlap at times. Every effort will be made to accommodate as many clubs as possible with opposite rotation schedules.

Club Attendance: Attendance is mandatory and tracked for ALL clubs. Clubs requiring attendance at more than one rotation will provide their members with that information via the club directory (requirements section).

Dues: Clubs may establish (and maintain) their own dues.

Status/Restrictions: Club sponsors may opt to make the club by invitation only, charge dues, limit the club to certain grade levels or students enrolled in particular classes, and set a maximum capacity. Questions regarding specific club requirements/restrictions/status must be addressed with the club sponsor. Clubs may establish a cap on their enrollment with enrollment being first come, first serve, followed by priority given to juniors and seniors. In the event a wait list is established, priority status will be as follows: seniors, juniors, sophomores, and freshmen.

Club Meeting scheduling/rotations/cancelations: All club sponsors are responsible for contacting the clubs coordinator concerning any changes to meeting schedules, rotations, location changes, or cancelations.
